



Lend Your Heart to Ukraine

The Oregon Trail Community Foundation launched the "Lend Your Heart to Ukraine" relief fund on March 5, 2022 at the OTCF Ag Recognition and Awards Banquet with a silent auction. This humanitarian effort gained widespread support from our community, raising over \$66,000 for humanitarian relief for Ukraine. The OTCF Ukraine relief fund partnered with Airlink, a rapid-response humanitarian relief organization that connects airlines and prequalified nonprofits to help communities in crisis.

Hod Kosman, OTCF Board member and President/CEO of Platte Valley Bank says: "The people of Ukraine need medical and humanitarian supplies delivered to the neighboring countries that have come to their aid. Airlink delivers people and humanitarian products to all those wonderful countries; a bit of sunshine in a very dark time."

Because of our community's contributions, more than 37 pallets of needed supplies were delivered to Ukraine, Moldova, Romania, Hungary and Poland. OTCF GRANTS

The American Legion / Gering

The OTCF grant helped the Gering Legion Post 36 replace the 62-year-old cement platform at West Lawn Cemetery with a covered pavilion. The pavilion is now wheel-chair accessible. Granite panels engraved with the emblems of the six branches of the US Military and names of deceased loved ones will be installed to complete the Pavilion. Historically, the platform has been used by the Legion on Memorial Day each year. The new covered Pavilion will be available to the community for memorial events, or as a supplemental space for funerals/celebrations of life. Awarded \$5,000



Cirrus House

In 2018 Cirrus House added an additional nine units to their housing program and with the help of grants, loans and donations were able to rehab six units and the entirety of the external structure. The second phase of this rehab process will complete the three remaining units by early 2023. OTCF was able to help with construction costs to finish these last three apartments. The long-term impact of three more affordable housing units will not only impact the residents of those apartments but their individual stability and success have the potential to positively impact each person's circle of influence of family, friends, and co-workers. Unlike shorter-term help, a safe, affordable housing unit can positively impact a community for decades of service.

City of Scottsbluff / 18th Street Plaza

The funds will be used to complete the final construction of the 18th Street Plaza. The new plaza design will create a more welcoming space for current and future events. A permanent stage will be built in the northeast corner near the great lawn where shade sails and lights will offer comfort and ambiance for event attendees. The northwest area of the plaza will include fire pits complete with curved benches to provide additional seating. Built in picnic tables and shade trees will be integrated along the southeast corner of the plaza and the newly designed park benches will be placed in various locations within the plaza. Both the Broadway and 1st Ave. entrances will feature a curved brick archway helping to define the plaza entrance.

Community Ever Green House

The Gering Community Ever Green House project will complete the south property as a pollinator habitat using 20 raised beds planted with drought tolerant native plants and flowers with ADA compliant paths throughout the property to allow full use for the community and showcase the Pollinator garden art that was installed in June, 2022. Their goal is to become a Certified Pollinator Habitat and become affiliated with the Nebraska Statewide Arboretum as a Community Arboretum. Awarded \$4,000

Empowering Families

This grant helped with the 24th annual Multicutlural Youth Leadershp Conference and Community Event. This conference served over 200 high school and middle school studens from across the panhandle. A community dinner was also provided at this conference. **Awarded \$1,000**

The Guadalupe Center

OTCF helped the Guadalupe Center all new chairs for the hall, for added safety and comfort for those attending community functions. **Awarded \$3,000**



Legal Aid of Nebraska

OTCF provided essential funds to complete their Civil Justice Center, so they can provide more education, outreach, and legal services to our friends and neighbors. **Awarded \$1,500**

Regional West Foundation

The priority campaign for Regional West Foundation is raising funds for a new Varian Edge™ linear accelerator for The Cancer Treatment Center at Regional West. The aim is to improve care for patients treated at Regional West. Proceeds of the campaign will fund:

- Purchase and installation of a linear Accelerator in the Cancer Treatment Center at Regional West
- Renovation of a room in the Cancer Treatment Center to accommodate the installation of the Linear Accelerator

The objective is to ensure that Regional West patients can continually access the most advanced, innovative and quality health care in a state of the art rural facility, close to where they live and work.

Awarded \$50,000

Scottsbluff Public Schools

New playground equipment at Lincoln Heights, Lake Minatare, and Westmoor Schools. Not only is outdoor play important to students, the playground is visible to prospective businesses and families looking to move into the area. Therefore, the benefits go well beyond the social, emotional and physical health of our children. Safe, engaging and modern playgrounds will benefit the entire community.





Theatre West

Grant used to replace and update sound system for the theatre, including purchase of wireless microphones. **Awarded \$4,000**

West Nebraska Art Center

Upgrades in the lighting system in the Bronson Gallery. This improved the lighting for both gallery and classroom use. Additionally, a light socket in the northwest stairwell was replaced with a fixture that would be appropriate to the history of the building. **Awarded \$2,000**



OTCF Total Assets (since 1980)




