OTCF Bring's Rachel's Challenge to Area Schools



Rachel Joy Scott believed in the power of kindness.

In an essay she wrote before her murder, Scott said, "I have this theory that if one person can go out of their way to show compassion, then it will start a chain reaction of the same. People will never know how far a little kindness can go."

Although her life was cut tragically short during the deadly massacre at Columbine High School in 1999, Scott's vision of a kinder world was shared with ten local middle school and high school students recently through Rachel's Challenge, an organization that aims to bring positive change to young people by quelling school violence and bullying. The program also focuses on Rachel's life, not her death, and her mission to look for the best in people, dream big and choose positive influences. In the months following the assemblies, both Scottsbluff and Gering high schools have formed a FOR Club (Friends of Rachel) that has been instrumental in creating new ways for student to share kindness and compassion with each other. Some of these ways have been simple to implement, like High-Five-Fridays, which requires participation and positivity as students passing each other in the hallways. Others are a bit more involved, like the "G Boutique" at Gering Junior High, and the Rachel's Closet at SHS, where students can donate gently used clothing to a school "store" where students in need can find something in an anonymous, judge-free environment.

We believe the program was successful in helping kids understand how their actions affect the people around them. We are hoping to bring this same program to other schools in the Panhandle in the future. If you would like to donate or get involved in the Rachel's Challenge, please call us at OTCF: 635-3393.
